Water education tools provide a way to immerse yourself in teaching resources and learning material, and makes it easy for you to weave engaging topics about water into your classroom.

What are water education tools?

Designed for teachers and students from kindergarten to Year 12, the water education tools website offers a growing library of catalogued learning material that brings together journals, education materials and documents, from various water organisations.

This educational resource has been developed by the Department of Water with guidance from the Curriculum Council and the Western Australian Department of Education and Training.

How do I use it?

This free service is accessed via the web from the Department of Water website, www.water.wa.gov.au.

The library has two primary navigation pathways, one for teachers and another for students.

The pathway for teachers allows you to navigate to resources catalogued by year group and linked directly to the Curriculum Framework and Year 11-12 science and geography syllabus.

Students can access the site to research school projects by navigating through an interactive multimedia portal to locate resources by year group and topic.
